Making St. Louis a Better Place for 40 Years!

For 40 years now, we have been working together to help keep city neighborhoods clean and looking their best. Join the effort and help keep your neighborhood clean! Start with just your block or organize something for your neighborhood. However you get started, Brightside has the tools to help you clear litter from your street and alley, clean up a vacant lot, plant flowers in public green spaces, pull weeds in your community garden and more. Together, we're making St. Louis a city in which we can all be proud!

First things first... Organize a Blitz Clean-up!

First, talk with your neighbors and then select a date, time and location for your clean-up or beautification project. Organize a Spring, Summer or Fall clean-up or one each season to keep your neighborhood in tip top shape. Register your project(s) with Brightside **at least one week in advance** to reserve brooms, rakes, shovels and other hand tools and trash bags -- for free! Litter grabbers and recycling carts are also available to help make clean-ups easy and keep recyclables out of the landfill. Complete the online form at **BrightsideSTL.org/Blitz**, use the enclosed Blitz Registration or call Brightside at 314-772-4646.

Did you know... You can request flowers for your neighborhood too?

Groups with registered projects may also request **FREE** annual flower seedlings for planting on public property. Register your Blitz project and submit your Flower Request Form by May 6th to be eligible for flowers. Flowers will be available for pick-up during designated hours on May 13th and May 14th at the Greenhouse in Forest Park.

If you're cleaning up a very large area... avoid overloading alley dumpsters!

For large community projects, a roll-off container may be placed in a designated location on Friday before your scheduled clean-up and will be collected the following Monday. Clean-up organizers must make sure that only appropriate items are placed in the container – trash, yard waste and bulk items <u>cannot</u> be mixed together. Roll-off containers must be requested in writing **at least 2 weeks before** your clean-up day and <u>cannot</u> be used for private property projects.

If you are cutting back tree limbs... pile them up so they can be hauled away!

Brightside can also arrange to have tree limbs chipped and hauled away when you notify us in advance. Limbs can be placed in one or two designated locations accessible for large trucks to drive through (for example, at the back edge of a vacant lot, not in the middle). On Monday after your clean-up, you will need to call Brightside with the locations of your limb piles. Forestry will chip limbs during that week, weather permitting. **This service is not for private trees**.

Don't forget... make arrangements for roll-offs and/or chippers at least two (2) weeks in advance!

Please email Gwen at <u>gwen@brightsidestl.org</u> at least two weeks in advance to make arrangements for your clean-up project. Also, it's helpful if you note the exact location of where you need a roll-off container placed in the "additional notes" section of our online Blitz Registration form. We will contact you with any issues and confirm your roll-off container or chipper.

If there will be bulk items cleaned up... schedule your Blitz right before your Bulk Pick-up Week!

Maximize your efforts by scheduling your clean-up the weekend before your bulk pick-up. This way, large, bulky items (furniture, appliances, etc.) can get picked up during the City's regularly-scheduled monthly bulk pick-up for your area. It couldn't be easier!

Sometimes the wrong things end up in the alley dumpsters... we have a guide for that!

Share a copy of the City's Ultimate Waste Disposal Guide with your neighbors! This guide is available online in English and Spanish. It contains information about all City waste services (trash, recycling, yard waste, bulk pick-up and more). If you would like to share this information with your neighbors, visit **STLCityRecycles.com/Downloads**, call Saint Louis City Recycles at 314-772-4646 or email recycle@stlouis-mo.gov to request a physical copy. The information in this guide will help keep your streets and alleys clean as well as explain how to properly dispose of items.

Do you need recycling info in another language? We have Recycling 101 information sheets available in Spanish, Mandarin, Bosnian, Vietnamese and Arabic, too!

If you want to learn how to beautify your neighborhood even more... don't miss these events!

Be sure to mark your calendar for important Neighbors Naturescaping events – May 12th for the Kick-Off meeting and June 4th for the St. Louis Urban Gardening Symposium. Through Neighbors Naturescaping, any community group in the city may request up to \$1,500 in native plants and tools to improve a public or nonprofit space in their area. Even if you are not interested in applying for a greening project, the June 4th Symposium is a great opportunity to learn about the importance of pollinators and native plants in our urban environment from our special guest presenters: Gerardo Camilo, Ph.D., Biology professor at Saint Louis University and Scott Woodbury, Horticulture Manager at Missouri Botanical Garden's Shaw Nature Reserve.

Talk with your neighbors today about organizing your Blitz project(s) to keep your neighborhood looking its best. We look forward to working together in 2022 to keep St. Louis city growing and thriving!

- 4. Submit a Blitz Blooms Flower Seedling Request online or via mail to Brightside by May 6th. We will have marigolds, dianthus and celosia.
- 5. Pick up your seedlings from the Greenhouse in Forest Park during designated hours on May 13th or 14th.
- 6. Plant your neighborhood's seedlings and water regularly. Don't forget to regularly remove all weeds and trash from your garden areas.



What: Hazardous waste collection facilities that accept household hazardous waste (HHW).

Examples: paints, oils, car batteries, fire extinguishers, cleaning agents and more!



Who: St. Louis City residents can dispose of the first 50 pounds of waste at no charge. Fees will be charged for HHW after 50 pounds. Residents can go once per day with a reservation.
